The Jan Bhagadari (compilation of year-long working with PRIs) is a regular annual publication of the Department since 2021-22 where efforts are made to capture activities/involvement of PRIs in the afforestation and allied works of the Department. I am hopeful that with these efforts, the publication would help disseminate information about various initiatives being taken up by the Department towards the involvement of common people through the PRIs for building mass movement in afforestation and related works and achieve the goals set by the Government.

Institutional Framework to involve PRIs in all afforestation and allied activities of the Department

Government of J&K has notified the J&K Social Forestry (Plantation) Rules-2022 vide SO 327 of 2022 dated: - 07.07.2022 which lay the institutional framework to implement the provisions for effective engagement of PRIs who are now work in close association with departmental functionaries to carry forward afforestation and allied initiatives in pursuit to move closer to the goal of having 2/3rd geographical area in UT under Forest & Tree Cover. Village Panchayat (Plantation) Committees are performing the functions relating to micro-planning, raising plantations, their protection, usufruct sharing and management of Gram Panchayats Fund out of the proceeds obtained from mature plantations and other allied activities as per the provisions of said rules.

Identification of land	No role	The lands for afforestation on non-forests lands are to be identified by concerned VPPCs in consultation with the Department.

Execution and Monitoring of works	No role	The execution and monitoring of works on non-forest lands is to be done by VPPCs.

Decisions about auction of mature plantations as per management plan	No role	The decision on final harvest of plants in plantation units (VWL) is taken by VPPC (EC) in accordance with the Management Plan & on advice of the Department.
Sharing of Final Harvest (Village Woodlots) and Utilisation of Money from Gram Panchayat Fund	The earlier Village Committee were receiving 75% share from harvest of mature crop from Village Woodlots	75% of the total revenue realized is deposited in the joint account of Village Panchayat Fund. The utilization of funds is proposed by VPPC (EC) by formulating action plan for the financial year, which includes fresh plantations, reafforestation on felled units, minor public utility works as per needs of the inhabitants of Gram Panchayat.

Strip/Institutional Plantations	No role	The plantations raised on road sides/canal banks/wetlands and within the Govt. Institutions are raised/managed by VPPC with the assistance of Department & concerned Department/ Institution. The final harvest thereof is to be shared in the ratio of 1:3 between the Department & VPPC concerned respectively. However, the 50% of VPPC share realized from the institutes like schools is to be earmarked for taking up developmental activities within the same institute.
Decisions about private lands	No role	One representative of VPPC stands incorporated in the Coordination Committee headed by Dy. Commissioner concerned.
Rehabilitation of Degraded Forests	No role	The plantation on forest areas is to be done by the Department following the standard norms. However, the VPPC (EC) are to be involved for protection of plantation & allowed to cut and carry grasses/ leaf fodder from such RDF units under supervision of concerned Range Officer (SF). The VPPCs are also duty bound to offer their services for protection of such plantations including protection from fire.
Farm Forestry	No role	The VPPC (EC) has to assess the viability & potential of successful raising & managing plantations. The VPPC (EC) is involved to ensure that plants taken under farm forestry are planted by the beneficiaries at right time and proper maintenance thereof is ensured.

Outreach and capacity building programmes	No role	The plantation drives are to be carried out by the Department by involving VPPCs & the general public/ institutions through outreach programmes. The distribution of pamphlets, booklets and success stories of field work is to be shared with the VPPC members to increase outreach & acceptability of the plantation initiatives. The Department has to organize capacity building measures to enhance the knowledge and skills of the VPPC (EC) to strengthen their role & effectiveness in afforestation programmes. Best performing VPPC at Province Level/District Level is to be identified in an objective manner and incentivized with awards to sustain their interest.
Maintenance of Village Woodlots	Motivation	The Village Wood Lot(s) (VWL) are to be handed-over to concerned VPPC (EC) for future management within 3 to 5 years of establishment. The VPPC (GB) shall be solely responsible for maintenance of plantations of such units thereafter. However, services of Social Forestry Department will remain available to VPPC (EC) for technical guidance whenever or wherever required under norms.
Recovery of damage from Village Woodlots	No role	In case of any damage reported, the VPPC (EC) has to recover the cost of damage (as per the latest rates issued by the Forest Department) from the offender. The amount recovered from the offenders is to be deposited in the account of VPPC (EC) and the proceedings shall be recorded in the record register.
Corporate Social Responsivity Scheme (CSR)	No role	The VPPC are authorized to receive the funding under corporate social responsibility component or other sources adopting the procedure laid down by the Government in this regard, so that financial resources under Village Panchayat Fund could be augmented. These funds are to be properly budgeted utilized and audited in consultation with VPPC(EC) under existing norms.





















GRAPH SHOWING NO. OF VPPCS INVOLVED (2022-23) ACTIVITY-WISE




